In accordance with the procedures set forth in the Daytona Beach Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, HURCON TWO is established effective June 1, 2016. (Day-to-Day Operations during Hurricane Season, June 1 to November 30).

After three of the quietest hurricane seasons in decades, U.S. meteorologists on Friday predicted the number of storms in the upcoming 2016 Atlantic hurricane season would be near normal, after fewer than normal storms last year.

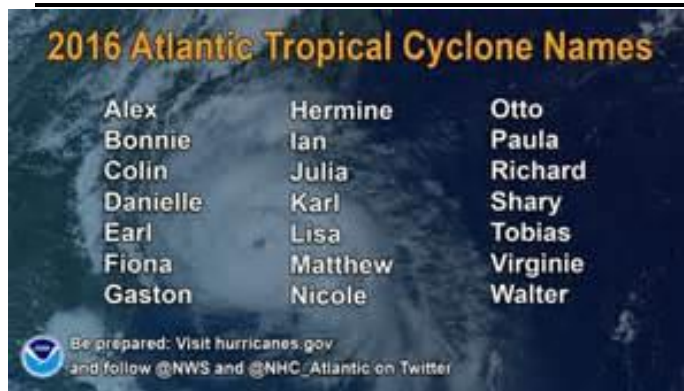
The U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) predicts a 70 percent likelihood of 10 to 16 named storms with winds of 39 miles per hour (63 kms per hour) or stronger, of which 4 to 8 could become hurricanes with winds of 74 mph or stronger, including 1 to 4 major hurricanes with winds of 111 mph or more.

While a near-normal season is most likely with a 45 percent chance, there is also a 30 percent chance of an above-normal season and a 25 percent chance of a below-normal season, NOAA said.

For all-hazards preparation information, be sure to review the various 2016 DISASTER PREPAREDNESS GUIDES that will be distributed online and in the media at the beginning of the 2016 Hurricane season, and review the City Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan for preparedness activities. Make sure all of your plans are up-to-date and you and your family are prepared.
